Survey of Market Compliance Mechanisms for EE Programs

- ▶ Project approved by BMC as EWG 07/2010A.
- ▶ RFP issued with cutoff of 31 January 2011.
- ▶ Bid received from International Institute for Energy Conservation – Asia (which also submitted a bid on EE street lighting project).
- ▶ Bidding may be reopened to competition.
- ▶ Ideas for potential bidders are welcome.
- ▶ Economy presentations offer a good start.

Compliance Issues – A

- ▶ Why are compliance rates important?
- ▶ How can high compliance rates be achieved in a cost-effective fashion? Which approaches have worked best? Common best practice elements?
- ▶ When should economies take remedial or enforcement action to ensure compliance?
- ▶ Should compliance regimes differ between voluntary and mandatory programs?
- ▶ Can compliance regimes for energy efficiency learn from other compliance regimes, such as for electrical safety?
