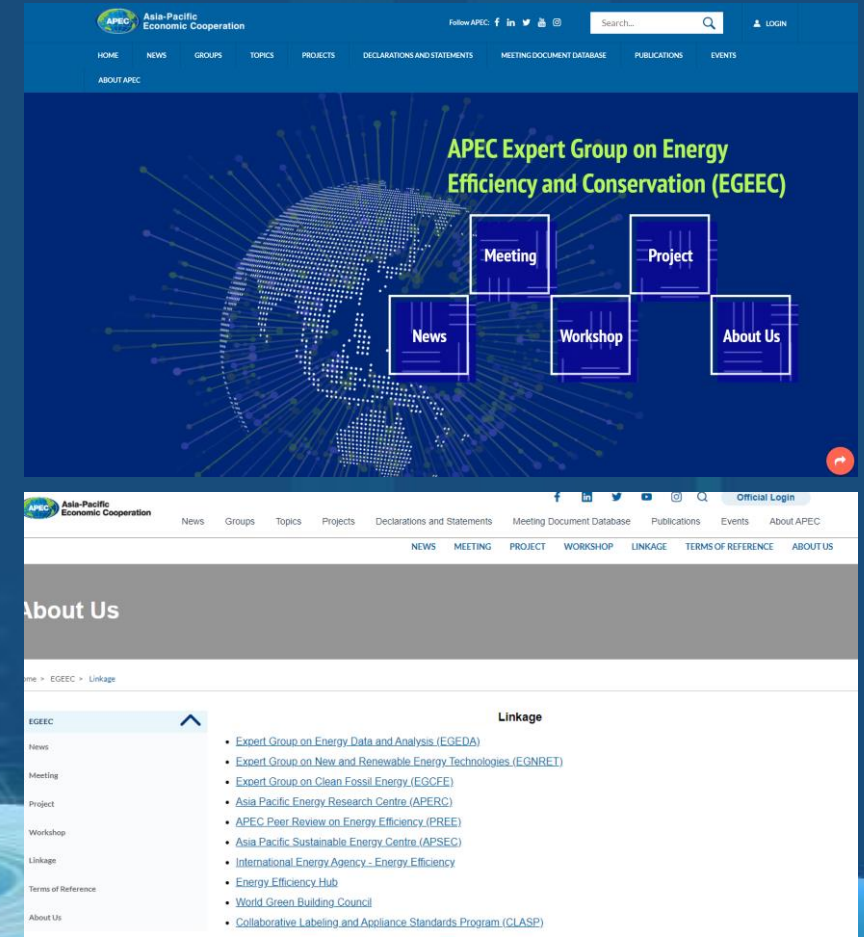

- Members are encouraged to regularly review and update the EGEEC contact list to build capacity and share knowledge in energy efficiency and conservation-related policy.



- The EGEEC ToR has a term of four years starting from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2025.

Objectives' section lists the following objectives: Enhance cooperation to achieve greater energy efficiency towards APEC's aspirational goal of reducing energy intensity by at least 45% by 2035, using 2005 as a base year; Advance the application of energy efficiency practices and technologies in opportune end-use sectors (residential, commercial, industrial, agricultural, transportation, etc.); Assist in developing and enhancing trade in energy efficient products and services between APEC member economies; Contribute to international efforts to reduce the adverse impacts of energy production and consumption upon our global environment; and Improve the analytical, technical, operational and policy capacity for energy efficiency and conservation within APEC member economies. The 'C. Strategies' section is partially visible, stating 'The strategies consist of the following major elements:'.

EGEEC Logo

- The EGEEC (since 1993) has been established for 30 years.
- In the EGEEC61 meeting, members proposed and agreed to create a logo to improve visibility and communication.

This design features a series of overlapping circular letters "EGEEC" in shades of blue and green, symbolising the collaborative, continuous, and interconnected nature of the EGEEC's work in addressing global environmental challenges while promoting sustainable development simultaneously.

The logo includes an "infinity" symbol, signifying the perpetual advancement of energy-efficient practices and technologies.

The design also pays tribute to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) by sharing the similar letter "C" to reaffirm our commitment to addressing climate change.
